Our school council have been collecting ideas from classes about what children would like to have on the playground. We will also be asking all children and staff to complete a survey to help us plan any changes we make.



January 29th was the start of the Great British Bird Watch across the whole country. Here at St Nathaniel's, all of our classes took time out of our busy learning to see which birds we could spot in our school grounds and in the community.

Q:What did the class do for the GB birdwatch day?

Miss Price: All of Y5 and Y6 spent time at Westport Lake observing an amazing array of different birds. We had a bird identification sheet which helped us to name the birds we saw. We recommend going there for a visit-it was fantastic!

Mr Bowler: In Y1 and Y2 we went outside and created tally charts of the birds we could see. We looked for 4 different types of birds in particular, we kept a tally chart then we recorded that information when we went back to class.

Mr Field: In Y3 and Y4 we went inside Bob's garden and used some binoculars and we had a look at all the birds. After identifying the birds, we created a tally chart. The children also created some fabulous artwork from what they saw.

Q: What did you build?

Children: We made our own bird feeder and at home on GB birdwatch day we put it in our garden so that birds come and get seeds.
